COMMANDERS MESSAGE:

The new year has just begun, but the VFW administrative year is more than half over. But no matter which calendar one looks at, there is more work to do—particularly in membership and community activity reports.

The Winter Conference, however, is a completed project. The attendance was good, and I want to thank all the comrades and sisters who attended. I hope you enjoyed the meetings, the camaraderie, the banquet, and the opportunity to mingle and talk VFW. From my perspective, it was a good conference. A good conference takes planning, and I thank Harry Huff and Kim DeShano for their behind the scenes work as well as Harry and Eugene Chavis for their work on the registration table.

After much discussion of the Fall Conference--over the past months at District meetings and with each other-- the Council of Administration voted overwhelmingly to eliminate the Fall Conference. The vote was 19 to 4. So, next year will be different. Perhaps even more people will attend the Winter Conference which will be held in Williamsburg at the Crowne Plaza Hotel.

Our "Day on the Hill" in Richmond on 12 January 2006 went very well. John McAnaw and the members of the Legislative Committee did an excellent job in preparing for the event. The line officers and I visited with the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House, and the Chairman of Appropriations. Our legislative agenda was well received. On January 18, several other Veterans representatives and I met with the Governor to hear his position on Veterans issues. I also received a letter from the Lieutenant Governor promising to follow up on our issues and to do everything he can to support our position. The rhetoric this year is promising. We will have to wait to see how the action plays out.

Let me close this month, as usual, with membership. I am pleased with our membership results to date, but we have a ways to go to hit 103%. We are currently at 91.7% and slightly ahead of last year. Our new/reinstated results are excellent. But, we must concentrate on renewing the annual members who have not yet renewed. Call, write, visit, or do all. We must not let them slip out the back door. Again, I want to thank all the members who have been doing such a great job recruiting. I may not have the opportunity to thank each of you personally, but I know who you are—thanks to a steady stream of letters from the National membership folks. We are on the way to another great year. Let's not slow down now.

LEGISLATIVE:

The Virginia Department of Veterans of Foreign Wars conducted its annual Legislative Day on the hill in Richmond on Thursday, 12 January 2006. Our visit occurred one day after the opening of the 2006 Session of the General Assembly.

A total of 38 members of the VFW and the Ladies Auxiliary participated in this highly important event. The offices of all 140 members of the General Assembly were visited and either the concerned legislator or the legislative assistants were briefed on the Department's legislative priorities. A listing of these priorities is provided in Section B below. Gov. (Elect) Tim Kaine was not available since he was at an undisclosed location away from the General Assembly Building. However, the senior leadership of the VFW Department of Virginia, led by Commander Dan Boyer, plus Senior Vice President Becky Mason of the Ladies Auxiliary, had an enjoyable visit with Lieut. Gov. (Elect) Bill Bolling.

Our visit was successful. Virtually every legislator and/or legislative assistant was receptive to the VFW legislative agenda. Since January 2005, there has been a favorable shift by the General Assembly and The Administration regarding meeting the needs of the Veteran community here in the Commonwealth. Members of the VFW Department of Virginia and the ladies Auxiliary played a key role in this shift. Thank you!

Lastly, I extend my gratitude to the following for his assistance in easing the travel inconvenience for participants on our Legislative Day on the Hill: Jon Hatfield, Director of the Virginia War Memorial.

There are 177 VFW Posts in Virginia consisting of 44,097, members. Of this figure, 9,216 are members of the Ladies Auxiliary.

The latest figure published by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (USDVA) indicates 750,950 veterans reside in Virginia. USDVA expenditures in Virginia for federal FY 2003-04 totaled \$1,705,113. A high percentage of these funds received by deserving veterans were spent in the Commonwealth.

Members of the VFW community in Virginia are rightfully proud of the contributions that they have made to our fellow citizens over the years. VFW posts throughout the Commonwealth sponsor and fund a wide range of community activities designed to benefit all Virginians-veterans and non-veterans alike. For the twelve month period ending April 30, 2005, the VFW Department of Virginia reported the expenditure of \$1,294,727 and 375,078 man-hours in support of numerous community activities for residents of the Commonwealth. The man-

hours cited above are valued at \$6,582,632, increasing the total value of VFW members contributions to \$7,877,359. The actual expenditure of money and man-hours are much higher because many posts do not report all the good work that they accomplished.

LEGISLATIVE AGENDA 2006

ISSUE ONE: THIRD VETERANS CARE CENTER

Request that the General Assembly provide the necessary funding for the construction of the third Veterans Care Center in the Hampton Roads area. Commitment of Commonwealth funding (35% of the cost) will move the project up on the priority list of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

ISSUE TWO: THIRD STATE-VETERANS CEMETERY IN SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA

There is an immediate need for a State Veterans Cemetery in Southwest Virginia. Near term action is needed to acquire, either by donation or purchase, suitable land for this cemetery. Request that the General Assembly provide, in a timely manner, the funding to acquire (if necessary) the land for the cemetery and for the operations/maintenance of the cited facility.

ISSUE THREE: BENEFITS DIVISION, DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

Request that the General Assembly approve budget amendments to the proposed 2007-08 biennial budget introduced by Delegate Cox for the following:

FY 2007:

- a. Fund eight part time administrative positions.
- b. Convert two part time administrative positions to full time.
- c. Upgrade four field offices of claims agents.

FY 2008:

At present, there are eight field offices devoid of administrative specialists.

ISSUE FOUR: VIRGINIA WAR MEMORIAL

Request that the General Assembly approve a budget amendment to the proposed 2007-08 biennial budget to appropriate \$4 million for the construction of the sorely needed education wing of the Virginia War Memorial.

Further request that the General Assembly insure that the necessary funds are available to give the Virginia War Memorial 24 hour a day/seven days a week security protection by the Capitol Police.

ISSUE FIVE: IN-STATE TUITION FOR ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY FAMILIES

Request that the General Assembly pass legislation, including the necessary budget amendment to the proposed 2007-08 biennial budget, to give in-state tuition rates to active duty military families living in Virginia pursuant to Permanent Change of Station orders.

ISSUE SIX: FISHER HOUSE AT MC GUIRE VETERANS ADMINISTRATION MEDICAL CENTER (VAMC)

Request that the General Assembly appropriate funds for the Commonwealth's share of the costs for the construction and support of a Fisher House on the property at the McGuire VAMC in Richmond, Virginia. Funding for this initiative is not in the Governor's proposed Biennial budget for 2007-08.

TRANSFER OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS SERVICES:

On Wednesday, January 18, 2006, Governor Tim Kaine signed Executive Order Number Eight (2006) transferring the responsibility for veterans services from the Secretary of Administration to the Secretary of Public Safety. The transfer became effective immediately upon the Governor's signing of the Executive Order. With this transfer, the Department will now be in the same secretariat with that of the Department of Military Affairs. This will facilitate greater cooperation between the department, Virginia's veterans, and the Virginia National Guard.

In addition, Governor Kaine announced the appointment of Vincent M. Burgess as Commissioner of Veterans services. He had served as Acting Commissioner since October 2005.

VFW SPECIAL INTEREST LICENSE PLATE UPDATE:

At the Winter COA meeting held January 14, 2006 in Williamsburg the COA voted to pay for the first 350 applications submitted to State Headquarters to insure the production of the plate. Now is the time to make the decision and submit your application to State Headquarters. Applications will be **FREE** to **THE FIRST 350 APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED TO STATE HEADQUARTERS**. The form is attached to the front of the General Orders.

AMERICANISM:

Only three months to go and still half the posts have not submitted an Americanism report in the Second Half. Use this slow February month to get caught up on Veterans Day and Pearl Harbor Day reporting, and your school and community events.
