ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE AT STATE CONVENTION:

National By-Laws, Section 213-Arrearage, Any Post in arrears for National, Department, County Council, or District dues, poppy money, supply money, or other financial obligations, or failing to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with section 703, or failing to submit properly completed Quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit or post Election Report shall be deprived of all representation in County Council meetings, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

GOLDEN AGE GAMES:

In closing I wish to personally "Thank" the Commander for the appointment and most definitely those that had a hand in making it a rewarding experience for me, and I hope I am around if/or when the games return to a VA Facility in Virginia.

VHDA's GRANTING FREEDOM PROGRAM HELPS MODIFY HOMES FOR DISABLED VETERANS:

The Virginia Housing Development Authority has initiated a new program to assist Virginia's servicemen and women – *Granting Freedom*.

The program makes grants up to \$4,000 available to veterans who were injured during combat and need some type of housing modification as a result. The grants are available to pay for modification work on Virginia homes or apartments to make them accessible.

"VHDA, in conjunction with the Department of Housing and Community Development and Community Housing Partners, currently has more than \$1 million in grant funds available to help veterans pay for modifications to their houses and apartments," said Ann Bolen, VHDA Special Funding Officer. "I encourage anyone to contact us if they know any veterans who may qualify for this grant program."

Granting Freedom helps fill a gap in existing services. Currently, disabled veterans receive federal assistance in modifying a home they own, but this assistance has not been available until now for rental housing. If property is rented, landlord approval is required.

Grants are available for accessibility improvements, including widened doorways, lower counters, wheelchair ramps, grab bars, Tubcuts®, visual smoke detectors and other modifications. A recommendation for the housing modification is required from a VA Hospital Rehabilitation Officer, VA attending physician or VA physical therapist.

Once approved for a grant, veterans will have 120 days to have the modification work completed and inspected. Once the modification is made and inspected, VHDA will mail a check to the contractor within 10 days.

Wachovia was the first private company to contribute to the *Granting Freedom* program.

The Internet cafes allow troops who do not have access to AT&T call centers to contact their families, as they so richly deserve. In an ever-expanding field of communication, **Operation Uplink** continues to strive to Connect Those who Serve, with Those Who Care.

POW-MIA COMMITTEE REPORT:

The remains of a U.S. serviceman, missing in action from the Korean War, have been identified and returned to his family for burial. Army Corporal Henry D. Connell of Springfield, MA was positively identified utilizing mitochondrial DNA. He was buried in his hometown.

The remains of seven U.S. Navy servicemen, missing in action from World War II, have been identified and returned to their families for burial. They are Ensign Lelant L. Davis, Jackson, MS; Ensign Robert F. Keller, Wichita, KS; Seaman 2d Class Elvin Alford, Bogalusa, LA; Seaman 2d Class Dee Hall, Syria, OK; Aviation Machinist Mate John H. Hathaway, Lafayette, IN; Aviation Radioman 2d Class Robert A. Smith, Glen Dive, MT; and Aviation Pilot Albert J. Gyorfi, Wilbur, WA. The seven-man crew was aboard a Navy PBY-5 Catalina out of Kodiak, AK on June 14, 1942, to attack Japanese targets in Kiska Harbor. They encountered inclement weather near the target and crashed on the Japanese-held island of Kiska. The remains were buried in a common grave. In 2002, the remains were found and positively identified by JPAC laboratory analysis.

The remains of four Army Air Force crewmen, missing in action from World War II, have been identified and returned to their families for burial. They are Captain Douglas R. Wight, Westerfield, NJ; 1stLt Herbert W. Evans, Rapid City, SD; Corporal John W. Hanlon, Arnett, OK; and Radio Operator PFC Gerald L. Rutgers, Jr., Tacoma, WA. All four were buried in Arlington National Cemetery. JPAC scientists and Armed Forces DNA Identification Laboratory used mitochondrial DNA, along with analysis of dental remains to confirm their identifications.

The remains of two Air Force servicemen, missing in action from the Vietnam War, have been identified and returned to their families for burial. They are Tech. Sgt Donald R. Hoskins, Madison, IN and Staff Sgt. Calvin C. Cooke, Washington, DC. A third person from the crew, Major Harry A. Amesbury, has been previously identified. On April 26, 1972, Amesbury was piloting a C-130E to An Loc City, South Vietnam for an emergency resupply mission. Hoskins and Cooke were among those aboard the aircraft when it was hit by enemy fire and crashed. JPAC scientists and Armed Forces DNA Identification Laboratory used mitochondrial DNA, along with analysis of dental remains to confirm their identifications.

The remains of eleven Army Air Force crewmen, missing in action from World War II, have been identified and returned to their families for burial. They are Cap. Thomas C. Paschal, El Monte, CA; 1stLt Frank P. Giugliano, NYC, NY; 1stLt James P. Gullion, Paris, TX; 2d Lt Leland A. Rehmet, San Antonio, TX; 2d Lt John A. Widsteen, Palo Alto, CA; SSgt Richard F. King, Moultrie, GA; SSgt William Lowery, Republic, PA; SSgt Elgin L. Luckenbach, Luckenbach, TX; SSgt Marion B. May, Amarillo, TX; Sgt Marshall P. Borofsky, Chicago, IL; and Sgt Walter G. Harm, Philadelphia, PA. On April 16, 1944, Paschael and Widsteen were piloting a B-24J with the other nine men aboard. The plane was last seen off the coast of New Guinea flying in poor weather. The group remains were buried at Arlington National Cemetery, with the exception of King, Giugliano and Widsteen, whose families have elected hometown burials. JPAC scientists and Armed Forces DNA Identification Laboratory used mitochondrial DNA, along with analysis of dental remains to confirm their identifications.

The remains of a Army Air Force serviceman, missing since 1942, have been identified and returned to his family for burial. He was Aviation Cadet Leo Mustonen, Brainard, MN.

JPAC Funding Shortfall: Inadequate funding levels for the Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC) has resulted in more than a dozen investigative and recovery operations being canceled in FY2006. JPAC funding is received through the U.S. Pacific Command, where it must compete with war fighting priorities, and is distributed on a quarterly basis with no carryover. This severely impedes JPAC operations and is not the way for the U.S. government to fund an American national priority. The VFW has called upon key members of Congress proposing a separate line item in the budget be earmarked for JPAC so that those in charge of the military do not have to make a choice between accounting for those who are missing and those prosecuting the war on terror.

Post, District, Department Commanders, Adjutants and Quartermasters are reminded of the requirements of Sections 216(c), 316, 414(c) and 515(d) of the National By-Laws with regard to proof of eligibility for all newly-elected and appointed officers. Elected and appointed officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed. Failure or refusal to submit proof of eligibility within sixty (60) days of election or appointment shall result in the office being declared vacant.
