JUDGING for awards will be on May 13 & 14, 2006. All judging material must be at State Headquarters by 5:00 P.M. (1700 Hours) on May 12, 2006. (NO EXCEPTIONS!)

BUDDY POPPIES DISTRIBUTION:

The distribution of VFW Buddy Poppies will be conducted according to the provisions set forth in Section 711 of the the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure. Post Commanders should arrange now for the distribution of Buddy Poppies in their respective areas.

NOTE: As the upcoming Memorial Day approaches, and given the daily hazards confronting our military on a daily basis during *Operation Iraqi Freedom*, it is appropriate that we direct as many VFW resources as possible to supporting our troops and their families.

In the ongoing effort to provide as much assistance as possible to those serving in the military, we recommend that proceeds or portions from this year's annual poppy distribution be designated for the purpose of providing VFW support to our military. Via the VFW Military Assistance Program (MAP), Posts and Departments now have the opportunity to assist qualified military personnel through the MAP *emergency financial grant* process.

In keeping with the intent of Section 704 (A) (C) of the Manual of Procedure "Relief Fund," this year's poppy campaign can play a direct role in demonstrating to those who are charged with protecting and defending our way of life that we appreciate and value their sacrifice.

IMPORTANT WARNING TO VETERANS:

KANSAS CITY, Mo., April 10, 2006--An organization called Veterans Affairs Services (VAS) is providing benefit and general information on VA and gathering personal information on veterans. This organization is not affiliated with VA in any way. This is their URL: <http://www.vaservices.org/us/index.html>.

VAS may be gaining access to military personnel through their close resemblance to the VA name and seal. The VA's legal counsel has requested that we coordinate with DoD to inform military installations, particularly mobilization sites, of this group and their lack of affiliation or endorsement by VA to provide any services.

As a general rule, never provide personal information such as SSN to anyone attempting to help them process a claim without first seeing their credentials.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP PAY OUT - 2007:

Wachovia Insurance Services, a professional actuarial firm, recently completed an evaluation of the Life Membership Fund. Based on this evaluation, the Life Membership Board of Trustees, pursuant to Section 111 of the VFW By-Laws, has determined that, for the 2007 membership year, the Life Membership Fund will pay out **\$3.50** for each **Plan A, B and C** life member, and **\$5.50** for each **Plan D** life member to their Post, Department and to National Headquarters. Payment will be made in September 2006 for all life members recorded as of August 31, 2006.

Memorial Day wreath laying ceremony will be held at the Albert G. Horton, Jr., Memorial Veterans Cemetery, Suffolk Virginia on 29 May, beginning at 2:00 p.m. All Post and Auxiliaries are invited to attend and participate in this annual ceremony. INSTALLING OFFICERS:

Installing officers will see that the provisions of Section 217 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure are properly carried out and that all officers are members in good standing and qualified to hold office prior to installing Post officers for the current year. Post officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed.

The installing officer shall ascertain that a Post Election Report has been mailed to National Headquarters prior to the installation. If a Post Election Report has not been forwarded to National Headquarters, the installing officer shall complete and forward such report at the time he installs the Post officers. Attention is directed to see that the proper amount of dues the Post charges is reported to National Headquarters. **Special Note:** All Post Election Reports are to be forwarded directly to National Headquarters who will be responsible for forwarding to the Department.

TERM OF OFFICE - DISTRICT OFFICERS:

District Officers shall be given the Officers obligation before the adjournment of the meeting at which they are elected but shall not assume the duties of their office until the Department Commander is installed following the Department Convention. Installing Officers shall ensure that a District Election Report is prepared and forwarded to Department and National Headquarters at the time of installation.

Pursuant to Section 405 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, each District shall hold an annual District Convention for the purpose of electing District Officers, such Convention to be held not less than ten (10) days nor more than seventy-five (75) days prior to the convening of the Department Convention. District Officers shall not assume the duties of their office until the Department Commander is installed. District Officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed in accordance with Section 414 of the National By-Laws.

NOMINATION, ELECTION, & INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS:

Attention is directed to Section 217 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure covering the nomination, election and installation of Post Officers. Post Election Report forms are being mailed to Post Quartermasters with instructions that they complete and return the forms directly to National Headquarters immediately following the election of Post Officers.

Section 222 of the National By-Laws provides that Posts shall elect delegates and alternates to County Councils at the same time the annual election of Post officers is held; two (2) delegates and two (2) alternates for the first fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each additional fifty (50) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Post at the time of the election.

Delegates and alternates to District conventions shall be elected at a regular Post meeting held not less than thirty (30) days prior to the District convention at which District officers are to be elected; one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each fifteen (15) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Post at the time of election or as the Department By-Laws may provide.

Delegates and alternates to the Department convention shall be elected at a regular meeting of the Post held not less than thirty (30) days prior to the Department convention. Posts are entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each thirty (30) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Post at the time of the election or as the Department By-Laws may provide.

Pursuant to Section 405 of the National By-Laws and Manual of Procedure, each District shall hold an annual District convention for the purpose of electing District officers, such convention to be held not less than ten (10) days nor more than seventy-five (75) days prior to the convening of the Department convention. District officers shall not assume the duties of their office until the Department Commander is installed. District officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed in accordance with Section 414 of the National By-Laws.
