As most of you are probably aware, the Life member and annual dues increases that were proposed passed at the VFW National Convention in Reno. These dues increases are designed to keep the organization as a whole in good working order well into the future. The Life increases are very high and in many cases are about a 75 percent increase. This will encourage new and reinstated members to become Post members as opposed to the past where Posts were competing with MAL dues of \$20. There is no doubt that it will be harder to recruit new members, but we have to go forward in a positive manner. The VFW is still a very economical organization to belong to when compared to others, and we are the foremost of Veterans service organizations. Let's offer the opportunity to all who are qualified the opportunity to join our ranks and be a part of the best.

DUES INCREASE:

The following by-laws changes were voted on and passed at the 107th National Convention in Reno, Nevada and will take affect January 1, 2007.

All Post are reminded that in accordance with the National Bylaws, that there Post dues must be at least equal to the amount of the National and Department Per capita which will be \$19.50 once the increase takes affect January 1, 2007. If your Post dues are not at least \$19.50 you must vote to increase them and to notify National the amount of the increase. Also in order to have the dues reminders that will be mailed out in January to have the correct amount of dues for your Post on them, you must notify National by the first of December so they have the correct amount when the reminders go to print mid December.

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

Section 102—Applications-Affiliation of New Members.

Amend the third paragraph, entitled "Members-at-Large", by deleting it in its entirety.

Amend the fourth paragraph, entitled "Department Members-at-Large" by substituting in its place the following:

Members-at-Large. Anyone eligible for membership who is unable to join or does not desire membership in a Post may become a Member-at-Large in a Department upon application to the Adjutant General or the Department Adjutant, proof of eligibility and payment of annual dues. Annual Dues shall be \$35.00, \$21.00 of which shall be National Organization Dues which shall be transmitted to the Quartermaster General monthly on a consolidated report and \$14.00 of which shall be Department Dues, provided the Department Council of Administration may establish some other amount as Department Dues.

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

Section 111—Life Members.

Amend Section 111, Life Members, National By-Laws, by substituting in its place the following:

(a) **Life Members:** Any person who is a member in good standing of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States may become a life member by payment of the applicable life membership fee to the Post Quartermaster. Any person otherwise eligible for membership, but not previously a member, may become a life member upon election to membership in accordance with Section 103, payment of any admission fee in accordance with Section 104 and submission of a life membership application and payment of the applicable life membership fee to the Post Quartermaster. A former member otherwise eligible for reinstatement to membership may become a life member upon reinstatement to membership in accordance with Section 106, payment of such reinstating fee as may be assessed by the Post and submission of a life membership application and the payment of the applicable life membership fee to the Post Quartermaster. With respect to Members-at-Large, the application and fee shall be submitted in the manner prescribed in the Manual of Procedure.

(b) **Life Membership Fees:**

(1.) Plan E Life Membership fees shall be charged in accordance with the following Plan E fee schedule effective January 1, 2007:

Attained Age	Plan E Life Member Fee
Through 30	\$425
31-40	410
41-50	375
51-60	335
61-70	290
71-80	225
81 & over	170

The applicable fee from the effective life membership fee schedule will be determined using the applicant's attained age as of December 31st of the current calendar year in which the application is submitted, regardless of actual date of birth.

Upon receipt of the applicable fee, the Post Quartermaster shall immediately forward payment together with the life membership application of the individual to the Quartermaster General (or, if required by the Department, through the Department Quartermaster to the Quartermaster General). In the case of Members-at-Large, the payment along with the life membership application shall be forwarded to the Quartermaster General. The life membership shall become effective immediately upon the receipt of the full fee by the Quartermaster General. The Quartermaster General shall deposit all sums received for life membership in a special fund called the Life Membership Fund, and shall issue a suitable life membership card.

A life member shall not be subject to further membership dues levies or life membership fees of any kind and shall have all the benefits and privileges of Post, Department and National membership as long as the member shall live; provided, however, a life member who shall subsequently be found ineligible for membership shall forfeit such life membership, in which case such life member shall be entitled to a proportionate refund of life membership fees paid. A life member who shall be discharged from the organization by reason of disciplinary action shall forfeit such life membership. In such event, no refund of fees paid will be made.

(c) **Life Membership Committee:** The Life Membership Committee shall consist of the Commander-in-Chief, the Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief, the Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief, the Adjutant General and the Quartermaster General. Such committee shall also be known as the Board of Trustees of the Life Membership Fund. The Quartermaster General shall be treasurer of the Life Membership Committee and shall have custody of the Life Membership Fund. The Life Membership Committee shall administer the Life Membership Fund, investing and reinvesting funds, to the best interest of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

(d) Annual Payment:

(1.) An amount, as determined by the Life Membership Committee after consultation with professionals licensed in actuarial science, shall be paid in September of the current year for the following calendar year to Posts, Departments and National Headquarters on all life members of each respective Plan recorded as of August 31 of the then current calendar year and, in addition, the same amount shall be paid in January of the following year for persons who have become life members during the period September 1 to December 31, provided, however, that, to the extent funds are available in the Life Membership Fund, payments to the Post to which the member belongs, Department and National Headquarters shall never total less than:

(2.) Death of a life member following issuance of the checks paying the member's per capita tax for the next calendar year to National Headquarters, Department and Post, shall not be a cause for a refund of such per capita tax for that calendar year.

ARTICLE VI – NATIONAL CONVENTION

Section 605 – National Dues.

Amend Section 605 – National Dues, National By-Laws, by substituting in its place the following:

Effective January 1, 2007, the National Organization dues shall be \$11.50 for every member of a Post in good standing, except Life Members, which shall include a year's subscription to the VFW Magazine.

Beginning January 1, 2007, \$8.50 of the National Dues, when collected from the member, will be retained by the National Organization and \$1.00, when collected from the member, will be rebated back to the Department to which the member belongs. The remaining \$2.00 will be distributed as outlined in Section 605 of the Manual of Procedure.

HOSPITAL:

Post Traumatic Stress Disorder

What is Post Traumatic Stress Disorder? PTSD is an anxiety disorder that can develop after exposure to a terrifying event or ordeal in which grave physical harm occurred or was threatened. Military combat can trigger PTSD, which can be extremely disabling.

Who develops PTSD? People who served in combat or who were POWs are among those at risk for developing PTSD.

When does PTSD first occur? PTSD symptoms typically begin within three months of a traumatic event, but might not begin until years later.

What are the symptoms of PTSD? Many people with PTSD repeat the ordeal in the form of flashback episodes, nightmares or frightening thoughts, especially when they are exposed to events or objects reminiscent of the trauma. People with PTSD also experience emotional numbness, sleep disturbances, depression, anxiety, irritability or outbursts of anger. Feelings of intense guilt also are common. Most people with PTSD try to avoid any reminders or thoughts of the trauma. PTSD is diagnosed when symptoms last more than one month.

How common is PTSD? About 30% of veterans who have spent time in war zones experience PTSD, according to the National Center for PTSD (www.ncptsd.org).

Who can get treatment and where? VA's Readjustment Counseling Service offers treatment at its 206 Vet Centers nationwide to veterans suffering from PTSD. The Vet Center sees vets from all wars and even those who served in places like Grenada. Every state has at least one center and some have more—California has 23. Vet Centers are critical for veterans and their families in the post-war adjustment phase. Readjustment and trauma counseling are just two areas of concentration at the centers. Emergency Medical Technician, Law Enforcement Officer, and Firefighter of the Year Candidate Requirements

Awards for Public Servants

Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Virginia selects an emergency medical technician, a law enforcement officer and a firefighter to receive outstanding Public Servant of the Year. These presentations of awards will be made at the VFW Department Convention in June. Post Safety Chairmen are encouraged to submit a candidate for these awards to the Department Headquarters by January 1st.

Emergency Medical Technician Gold Medal

Any individual who actively gives emergency medical treatment, provides rescue service or civil disaster assistance as a member of any public or volunteer company organized to give emergency medical care, provide rescue and civil disaster assistance to our nation's citizens.

Law Enforcement Gold Medal

Any individual who serves in a municipal, county, state or federal unit tasked with enforcement of the laws pertaining to their area of responsibility. This award does not apply to individuals employed by private companies or security services.

Firefighters Gold Medal

Any individual who actively fights fires as a member of any public or volunteer company organized to fight fires and give assistance to our nation's citizens.

Criteria for all Public Servant of the Year

Awards:

Candidates must have demonstrated:

- Recognition by their colleagues or those they serve.
- Consistent excellence in the performance of their duties.
- Consistent dedication to their official responsibilities over a period of years and continuous growth in responsibilities and skills within their profession.

Documentation required for all candidates:

- Nomination letter containing the candidate's name, title, address, telephone and identifying the award for which the individual should be considered.
- One page resume of the candidate's overall background.
- One page resume of the candidate's background in their field.
- One page listing of the candidate's accomplishment and awards in their field.
- Photograph (preferably a head shot) of the candidate.
