1. Support the Virginia Department of Veterans Services (DVS) Strategic Plan and Budget.
2. Funding for the Virginia War Memorial - Education Center.
3. Funding for the Virginia National Guard and Reserve.
4. State Tax Exemption for Virginia residents while serving in war or conflict areas.
5. Pay Day Lending Law - stop lenders from preying on military personnel and civilians by charging excessive interest rates.
6. Permitting Veterans Organizations to fly the American Flag over Interstate Highways.

We need maximum attendance at this event to demonstrate to our elected officials that Veterans Issues in the Commonwealth of Virginia are very important. We look forward to seeing a large turnout.

POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE:

This month we will focus on one of the 2006-2007 VFW Legislative Priority Goals of the Veterans of Foreign Wars; Veterans Administration Budget.

VA Budget

Ensure that sufficient funding is consistently provided and appropriated for the Veterans Health Care Administration so that it can fulfill its obligation to care for all of our nation's sick and disabled veterans.

Ensure that VA has a proper funding mechanism that matches funding with demands so that the Department of Veterans Affairs receives the appropriate level of funding to adequately care for all our nations veterans in a timely manner.

Currently, the VA Budget is in 'limbo'. The budget for 2006-2007 has not been approved by Congress and will not be until, at least, February 15, 2007. That will be 4 ½ month delay. This delay affects every Veteran that needs help from the VA, from health care to housing. It is imperative that we elect a Congress that will be receptive to the needs of our Veterans.

Our collective **VOICE** makes a difference.

POST SERVICE OFFICER OF THE YEAR PROGRAM:

It is now time to submit nominations for the 2007 Post Service Officer of the Year Award. For those of you who may not have previously received this guidance, following is an overview of the program.

OBJECTIVE:

The Post Service Officer is the crucial first link for veterans and their dependents at the "grass roots" level. This program is designed to provide annual VFW National recognition to a VFW Post Service Officer who provided exemplary service to veterans and their families.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

1. Nominees for the annual award must have demonstrated exceptional efforts in assisting veterans and their families during the 12 months preceding a **February 28, 2007**, deadline.
2. A brief summary is to be submitted which explains the **who, what, when, where, and how** the nominee's efforts are considered exemplary.

AWARDS:

Each department may nominate one person, who is a **duly appointed** and currently serving Post Service Officer, for this award. The individual who is ultimately chosen as the recipient of the award will be furnished round-trip travel (for the winner and one guest) and hotel accommodations to attend the National Veterans Service Spring Proficiency Training Conference (April 22-26, 2007), where the award will be presented. A stipend in the amount of \$500.00 will also be given to the recipient to cover out-of-pocket expenses incurred in connection with the trip. In addition the recipient will receive an additional \$250.00 stipend to offset expenses incurred to attend his/her state convention.

Nominations may be sent to me either by mail (ATTN: PSO Award), FAX at 866-416-0586 or email at quartermaster@vfwva.org.

Nominations must be received no later than **January 31, 2007**.

PREPARING A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE NATIONAL BY-LAWS:

Proposed amendments to the National By-Laws must have Department approval if submitted by a Post, District or County Council, and must be received by the Adjutant General by the first working day in July in order that they may be publicized as required by Article XIV of the National By-Laws.

If you want to propose a change to the By-Laws, Manual of Procedure & Ritual or Congressional Charter, it must be submitted as such, not as a resolution.

Such proposed amendments must be definite and specific as to the material to be deleted or added, containing the exact wording of the proposed change.

By-Law changes not in proper form, unclear as to meaning, or concerning matters clearly not within the scope and purpose of the Veterans of Foreign Wars cannot be considered by the National Convention.

If you need assistance in preparing any amendment, please contact us and the staff will be glad to help you with advice and assistance in properly preparing a proposed amendment. But, please give us sufficient time to do so keeping in mind the By-Law time limitation.

PREPARING A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

The policy of the Veterans of Foreign Wars is established by resolutions adopted by the delegates attending Department and National Conventions. Most such resolutions originate at the Post level and are passed through the District and Department before being acted upon at a National Convention. Many times, an otherwise worthy idea gets nowhere merely because it is not correctly presented.

General speaking, a resolution contains two separate parts; a statement of the problem to be solved, and the proposed solution to the problem. The problem is outlined in the "WHEREAS" clauses, and the proposed solution is given in the "RESOLVED" section.

The RESOLVED section of a resolution should be complete in itself without depending on the "WHEREAS" clauses to give it meaning.

HOW NOT TO PREPARE A RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, the rising cost of living has created an intense hardship on those disabled veterans whose only income is a meager pension check; and

WHEREAS, non-service connected pensions should be increased accordingly; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that we petition Congress to do so immediately.

(Note: The "RESOLVED" section says nothing when it is separated from the "" clauses.)

HOW TO CORRECTLY PREPARE A RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, the rising cost of living has created an intense hardship on those disabled veterans whose only income is a meager pension check; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that we petition Congress to enact legislation which would provide a substantial increase in non-service connected pension rates.

(Note: The RESOLVED section now has a proposed solution that makes sense and can stand alone without the ""WHEREAS"" clause having to give it meaning.)

A resolution may deal with a local problem, in which case it needs no action on a level higher than that of the Post. If the problem concerns an area larger than that served by the Post, it should, after Post approval, be presented before the District or County Council. All resolutions of statewide, regional or national concern must be acted upon by the Department Convention. Those resolutions approved by a Department Convention, which affect persons or matters outside the state boundaries, must be forwarded to the National Convention for final disposition.

When submitting resolutions to the Department Convention, a notation on the bottom should show the previous action taken ... approval by Post and, if applicable, by the District or County Council.

Since the Department and National Conventions are held only once a year, it is of prime importance that Post resolutions be acted upon and submitted to the Department Adjutant at least a month prior to the opening of the Department Convention.

Resolutions not in proper form, unclear as to meaning, or concerning matters clearly not within the scope and purpose of the Veterans of Foreign Wars cannot be considered by the National Convention.

HANDLING OF RESOLUTIONS

The policy of the Veterans of Foreign Wars is established by resolutions adopted by the delegates attending Department and National Conventions. Most such resolutions originate at the Post level. All resolutions of statewide, regional, or national concern must be acted upon by the Department Convention. Those resolutions approved by a Department Convention, which affect matters outside state boundaries, must be forwarded by the Department Adjutant to the National Convention for final disposal. A resolution disapproved by the Department Convention or not acted upon by the Department Convention will not be considered by the National Convention.

Resolutions may also be originated by Department officers or by the Department Convention itself and acted upon by the Department Convention. A National Officer may originate a resolution concerning National affairs and submit it directly to the National Convention without Department action. Likewise, a National Convention Committee may originate a resolution and present it for approval during the National Convention.

Policy set by the National Convention is binding upon all subordinate units of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. No Post or Department is permitted to take any individual action or espouse any cause contrary to the National By-Laws or to the actions of the National Convention EXCEPT that it may propose changes in policy by the preparation of a resolution for consideration as outlined in PREPARING A RESOLUTION.

SCOUTING:

Our Scouting team has done a great job of supporting the Scouting team uplink. We contributed over \$2500 from units across the department. At national the program is still in progress with us as a key contributor. Thanks to all the districts and posts who supported this effort.

We are still working on a form to show Scouting efforts by our members in support of the VFW volunteer program and by Scouts doing service for the VFW. Initial efforts by troop 1919 have been documented as an example and it has been provided to our scouting team as an example. Over a 6 month period our Members involved in scouting in that unit have provided almost 1000 hours of service to scouting. We will be talking to our Scouting team members about this at the January meeting. Sure would like every post to pick up on this.

The Freedom award is being used by one of our local schools. It is part of the school class and generated over 100 Patriots pen entries for Post 1503. The post will take several members to visit the school and talk to the students as a group to cover part of the award requirements. We need to get the criteria professionally printed and distributed.

VFW Post 7916 is organizing an effort to sponsor a Sea Scout unit in Occoquan, VA. They are on the waterfront. This is a Great opportunity for Post publicity, help to the city of Occoquan and provide a different Scouting opportunity for VFW sponsorship in Virginia.

Upcoming is a closer liaison of VFW with JROTC units from the national level. Since JROTC units can register as Venture crews and participate in special scouting programs designed for JROTC at local camps and take advantage of BSA insurance coverage that schools do not provide, there may be an opportunity to work together with our Scouting team to work with the JROTC programs.

Please request all posts to find a Scout of the year. Entries due 1 March at the Post.

VACANCIES AND REMOVAL OF ELECTIVE OFFICERS:

Sections 220, Vacancies and Removal of Elective Officers, of our National By-Laws says, "Any elective officer whose membership is **not** in good standing by reason of failure to pay current dues to December 31 shall forfeit his eligibility to hold office and said office shall be held vacated. Any elective officer whose office is vacated by the Department Commander by reason of failure to pay current dues or by vote of the Post under the provisions of this Section shall not be eligible to serve in any Post office in the same administrative year in which the office is vacated."

VFW SPECIAL INTEREST LICENSE PLATE UPDATE:

At the Winter COA meeting held January 14, 2006 in Williamsburg the COA voted to pay for the first 350 applications submitted to State Headquarters to insure the production of the plate. To date we have only received 172 applications. We need 350 applications before DMV will put the plate into production, so I am asking everyone to please fill out the application to put a VFW plate on your vehicle for at least one year at **NO COST TO YOU**. This will put the VFW plate into produced, after that one year if you don't want to pay the additional \$10 to keep the plate just turn it into DMV and they will give you a plain plate back. This VFW Plate can have the permanent Handicap emblem on the plate.

The form is attached to the General Orders. Please notify your Membership! It is a shame that we have not received the 350 applications that are necessary to begin production. There is no cost to send the application in, please pass the word along!

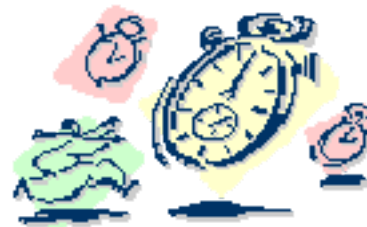
