Accordingly, the presence, dispensation and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the Post meeting room during the Post meeting is completely unacceptable and any such practice known to exist shall be terminated.

It is the intent of the Commander-in-Chief's decision, regarding this response, to include Post, County Council, District and Department meetings, whereas it is held to be objectionable. Please refer to Section 1001 (24.) of the National Manual of Procedure.

The VFW Virginia's will be visiting the General Assembly on **Thursday, January 15, 2009**. Please mark your calendars for the morning to show our strength to our senators and delegates in the General Assembly. Plans are to meet at the Virginia War Memorial, 621 South Belvidere Street, at 8:00 AM for coffee, donuts, and a briefing on veteran's issues. After the briefing, a bus will depart for the General Assembly around 9:00 AM and return about 1:00 PM.

At this time, the VFW Legislative Package consists of six main issues:

1. Employment of TurboVet System.
2. Burial Vaults for Virginia State Veterans Cemeteries.
3. Real Estate Tax Exemption for 100% Disabled Veterans.
4. Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunities for Military Children.
5. Military Family Relief Fund Tax Exemption.
6. Homeless Veterans Study.
7. Criteria for Names of Virginia War Memorial

Based on the \$2.9 billion budget deficit and economic downturn in the Commonwealth of Virginia, this will be a difficult year on funding issues in the General Assembly. It is of vital importance to have a large turnout in order to show that we care for our veterans and their families. In advance, I thank you for your support.

**Sailor Missing from WWII is Identified**

The remains of a U.S. serviceman, missing from World War II, have been identified and will be returned to his family for burial with full military honors. He is **Ensign Robert G. Tills, U.S. Navy**, of Manitowoc, Wisconsin.

December 15, 2008  
**6 Servicemen MIA From Vietnam War are Identified**

The group remains of six U.S. servicemen, missing from the Vietnam War, are soon to be buried with full military honors. They are **Maj. Bernard L. Bucher**, of Eureka, Ill.; **Maj. John L. McElroy**, of Eminence, Ky.; **1<sup>st</sup> Lt. Stephen C. Moreland**, of Los Angeles; and **Staff Sgt. Frank M. Hepler**, of Glenside, Pa., all U.S. Air Force. These men will be buried as a group on Dec. 18 in Arlington National Cemetery near Washington, D.C.

Two other servicemen, who were individually identified in October 2007, are also represented in this group. They are **Capt. Warren R. Orr Jr.**, U.S. Army, of Kewanee, Ill., and **Airman 1<sup>st</sup> Class George W. Long**, U.S. Air Force, of Medicine, Kansas
